What is InterLINK? InterLINK is a federated public library system, a partnership of eighteen public libraries in southwestern British Columbia

InterLINK's Legal Name: InterLINK Federated Public Library System

Date of establishment: InterLINK was established after operating for 19 months as a pilot project on April 1, 1994. InterLINK was comprised of 12 member library boards at its time of establishment. Today it is a successful federation of 18 public libraries.
